Overview

LOGLINE:A resolute man unapologetically abandons his first-born, believing that it was the right thing to do. Many years later, an inquisitive documentary filmmaker interrogates him.

SYNOPSIS:Alfredo, now in his fifties, blissfully lives with his family among his pigs and chicken at a rural town in Laguna. It is a humble place, but it is one that he built throughout the years of holding on to his own drive to be independent despite his poor economic means. He has been living independently since he was in high school. Although his father had offers to send him to college during his early years, he refuses. He thinks that he will not make it through and that the attempt would be futile. While in high school, he falls in love with a young woman who is about the same age as him and he bears a child with her. However, because of many issues, the most glaring one of which is the gap in their social status, the relationship fails. He initially attempts to keep their child, but soon realizes that he does not have the means to raise him. Resolute, he turns over the child to the young woman and her family, thinking that this would be the best for his son. He never looks back since. One day, a filmmaker approaches him to interrogate him about the choices that he made that lead to and after he got separated with his first-born. While happily living with his new family, he recounts what happened to his first-born and explains why he made the decisions that he did and retrospectively, how he now feels about the whole ordeal.

Overview:

Singapore: a bustling metropolitan city-state. In a staggeringly short timespan, it has become a 'first world' nation despite its geographical and historical limitations. But what does this



Overview

Tooi was born in the northeastern part of Thailand to a father of a former Japanese soldier—and a mother of a Vietnamese Thai. His father was impersonating a Vietnamese, opened a photo studio there. His father and his family, who went to the Japanese embassy, went to Japan when Tooi was eight years old. Tooi becomes Masato in Japan and lives as a Japanese. he learned Japanese immediately, but someday he couldn't speak Thai at all.

After that, 28-year-old Masato, who aspired to be a photographer, traced his memory and set out on a trip to Bangkok, Thailand, and to his hometown of Udon Thani. Eventually, Tooi, who was sleeping deep inside Masato's heart, wakes up quietly. In addition, he crosses the Mekong River (across the border) following his father's memory.

Kobayashi (Director), also a photographer, followed Masato's memories and appearances in Fukushima, Thailand, and Laos. The purpose was to find a phantom piece of Masato's past, as well as a picture of the King of Thailand taken by Masato's father. A documentary that traces the memory of the intersection of the Mekong in Thai and Abukuma rivers in japan.

Kisei Kobayashi, the director of this film, has been photographing Southeast Asia since his 20s. That led to his interest in the life of a fellow photographer born in Thailand.

This is a documentary about one Japanese photographer as he follows another Japanese photographer.

Director Biography - Kisei Kobayashi

Born in 1968, Nagano. Graduate of the photography course at Tokyo Polytechnic University, Junior College Department. He joined a newspaper as a photographer and began working independently in 1991. Since his 20s, he has travelled in Asia and made many works. Writings include ASIAN JAPANESE, Unfamiliar Memories, Shape of Love and more. He received the Best New Photographer Award from the Photographic Society of Japan and Tadahiko Hayashi award.

He has been working for KBS as a sports producer since 2003 and mainly produced sports documentaries.




Bo's interest & love for directing was sparked watching Hong Kong dramas.


Director Biography - Yupa Petcharit





Overview:

How can we describe 27-year-old Musoon KWON? A part-time employee at a franchise store? A musician in a band? A boxer? Or unemployed? Musoon introduces himself in front of the camera. His family broke apart in the aftermath of the Asian financial crisis and he barely managed to graduate from college, but... Musoon says that his identity is not something that can be defined with a word or two. And he stands on the road one day. Musoon, Across the Universe is a visual record of an 11-day journey from Busan to Seoul by Musoon and his friend PARK Taewon, who run 470 kilometers between the two cities. Walking the distance is difficult enough, so why are they running? It is not an attempt to prove or accomplish something; rather, it is simply an act of propelling their body forward. On the road, Musoon and Taewon experience conflicts, get lost, enjoy nature, and meet new people. The film represents a walking of a street. And it represent not only the flow of a person's consciousness but also revelation of the Materiality. Arranging the scenes of their physical activities and interview in a rooftop apartment, director NAM Seung-suk paints an achromatic portrait of a youth who refuses to be easily defined. A small light that penetrates the darkness in the opening and the ending scenes leave a long afterimage for the viewers.


Director Biograpghy: Seung- suk Nam

Overview:

When RMS Titanic sank on a cold night in 1912, barely 700 people escaped with their lives. Among them were six Chinese men.
